WHAT IS FEE-FOR-SERVICE?

- · Payment is based on what services are provided.
- The current fee-for-service model encourages higher usage of services and procedures – a dynamic at direct odds with health and wellness.

WHAT IS VALUE-BASED CARE?

- Payment is based upon the quality of the care that is provided and linked to patient outcomes.
- Primary care practices are resourced to keep patients healthy and proactively address chronic conditions rather than wait until patients get sick to provide care.
- Encourages effective and efficient care coordination with other specialists which reduces fragmentation across the health care delivery system.

PRIMARY CARE IS LEADING THE CHARGE FOR VALUE

Primary care physicians and care teams serve as a patient's initial point of entry into the health care system, focusing on health and wellness, including effective management of chronic conditions. And primary care teams play a central role in coordinating a patient's care with other specialists and helping patients navigate the complex health care system - leading to improved patient experiences and outcomes.
